# BALI Checklist

### Paperwork

Please submit the following documents to info@eliabroad.org as soon as possible. Your placement cannot be secured until these are received.

#### **Application Fee**

\$200 application fee must be received before your placement can be secured.

#### Passport

A valid passport is required for ALL international travel. Please check the expiration date on your passport. If it expires LESS THAN 6 MONTHS after the start of the trip, you will need to renew your passport. If you need to order or renew your passport and you are a US citizen, you can do so here: http://travel.state.gov/content/passports/english.html.

If you are a citizen of any other country, please check with the State Department in your country for details on how to order or renew a passport.

## Visa

US Citizens are not required to get a visa to Indonesia in advance. You will get a 30-day entrance visa upon your arrival in the airport. Your visa can be easily extended once you are in Bali. If you are staying longer than 30 days and would like to get your visa in advance, ELI will provide you with a letter of invitation for the application. Citizens of any country other than the USA should check with the Indonesian Embassy in their country or region for information on the visa process.

#### Medical Insurance

All participants are required to carry travel medical insurance for the entire duration of their program. This insurance needs to primarily cover major catastrophe events. Standard doctor visits and other minor medical concerns are easier paid out of pocket in most countries. Check with any current medical insurance you may have to see if you can there is a possible travel addendum you can purchase for your trip. If not, travel insurance can be purchased separately relatively inexpensively. For more information on travel medical insurance options please see our resource page here:

#### Vaccinations

There are no required vaccinations for entrance into Indonesia. There are, however, recommended vaccinations that all participants should consider. We HIGHLY recommend making an appointment to see a doctor who specializes in travel medication in order to determine which vaccinations are best for you. #### Flights

Airfare can be the most expensive aspect of any trip abroad. You should begin looking at flights to Bali and comparing prices now. For information and suggestions on booking tickets, please see our resource page here: www.eliabroad.org/airfare.

Please make sure you are arriving on your set arrival date. Participants who arrive before the arrival date, (or after 8pm on the arrival date) will be required to obtain their own housing until the beginning of the program.

#### Waiver Form

A signed copy of the waiver form is due 30 days before the start of your program. It may be sent by email.

#### **Program Fee**

Due 30 days before the start of your program.
